I Am a Proud College Graduate

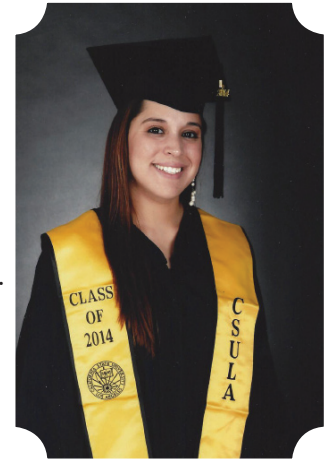
This is an unbelievable dream I never thought would actually occur. I was in the foster care system for eighteen years. I emancipated from the foster care system at the age of eighteen and have been living on my own ever since. Without the help I receive from Journey House I would be lost and, most likely, not able to continue my education.

I was taken away from my biological parents due to malnutrition and their drug use when I was three months old. I lived with my foster mother for sixteen years until she got deathly sick and died in 2007. Her death took a toll on my life, but I never gave up, especially in pursuing an education. It was always my goal to earn a degree in Social Work.

I attended Pasadena City College and earned my AA Degree in Sociology. My experience at PCC was wonderful. I was well connected with the financial aid office which helped me with scholarships. I struggled in the beginning of my first two semesters because my mom passed away, and I had to take a year off to get my mind back on track and get passed that emotional time. After PCC I enrolled at California State University, Los Angeles and entered their Social Work Program. My experience at Cal State L.A. was great.

I enjoyed all my courses and made so many friends. I always struggled in math which I ended up repeating three times. But I eventually passed all my required courses. I applied for EOP which is a program that helps low income students with books and counseling. Journey House was able to help me with my quarterly parking pass which cost \$90 and my books when I couldn't pay for them. With the help of the financial office and Journey House, I was able to receive my Bachelors in Social Work. I got accepted into Cal State L.A.'s Master's program in Public Administration. In September 2014, I started my graduate studies. Who would have thought!

I am very grateful to Journey House for helping me financially when I needed it, encouraging me to continue my education, but, most of all, just being available when I need to talk and discuss things. This agency does a lot of good for foster youth who really need the help, especially after years of living in the foster care system with very few resources.
